NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Youth Market Livestock Record Book Guidelines

It is suggested that a copy of the record book be made for use as a "work copy" and the information be transferred to a 'final copy" to be submitted to the Fair.

- Record books will be reviewed and any exhibitor submitting an incomplete record book will <u>RECEIVE A ZERO</u> <u>AND</u> will be notified along with their Leader/ Advisor. The exhibitor along with a parent or advisor will be required to complete the record book at final check in to be eligible for show and participation at the Central Florida Fair. The exhibitor will be given a 2-hour window to complete & resubmit on final check in day. Any record book deemed incomplete at resubmission will forfeit the exhibitor from participation & show at the Central Florida Fair.
- Buyer Letters must be attached and Typed in order for the Record Book to be accepted.
- Record books must be complete at time of submission. Parents and advisors/leaders are responsible for reviewing for completeness prior to signing.
- Record Books MUST be completed on the animal relating to your Youth Livestock Project.
- Completed Record Book must include Printed Photos of your Current Project Year.
- Do not put record book in a binder or folder. If you need to add pages, staple in the left hand corner.
- Always double check your work, especially your math calculations.
- Have someone check your project story for spelling and grammar before you write it in the final record book.
- Your final record book MUST be hand written by the EXHIBITOR.
- Exhibitors with an IEP need to provide an accommodation sheet if applicable by the submission deadline. IEP's will be attached to score card for grading committees.
- Graded record books will be returned during the Fair.
- Exhibitor must score 70 or better to receive record book recognition.
- Exhibitors will be in age divisions; junior, intermediate and senior. Refer to the premium book to determine age definitions.
- Points will be earned towards champion exhibitor.
- Record books are judged on the Modified Danish System; blue, red, & white.

*Youth who **DO NOT** have a 2.0 GPA will need to obtain an 2.0 Academic Exception Form from the Central Florida Fair; authorizing the exhibitor to participate in an extra-curricular activity with the possibility of missing school days. The document can be found on our Website. The document must be signed by a principal/assistant principal, guidance counselor, home school/virtual school director or County 4-H Agent **ONLY** AND notarized. Forms must be turned in via Link by February 5, 2025 by the Signing Admin, County 4-H Agent or Leader/ Advisor. Failure to provide this document will result in disqualification, NO EXCEPTIONS. The Central Florida Fair reserves the right to check for verification.

Exhibitors must submit their Report Cards & Homeschooling Forms no later than February 5, 2025 via the Submission Link on the CFF Website. Link will be open January 1 for the SEMESTER 1 Report Cards. The first semester includes both 1st and 2nd nine weeks grades and semester exams if required, for the 2024-2025 school year. An official report card that exhibits grades for the preceding semester is the ONLY acceptable evidence allowed for entry. The Report Card must clearly state the Exhibitor's First & Last Name and School Name on it. Report Cards not submitted by deadline will deem the exhibitor ineligible to exhibit at the Central Florida Fair.

Project Terms and Explanations

Notes for Project Inventory

Examples:

- 1. Project Year Based on a calendar year. Current project year is same year as current Fair.
- 2. **Date acquired** List the date you obtained this item, on items older than 1 year, the year will be sufficient. If you are borrowing items you still need to list the item.
- 3. **Purchase cost or value** What did this item cost when you obtained it? (Fair market value)
- 4. Value at Beginning of Project- Same as purchase cost for items purchased current calendar year. On items from previous years this should be the value from last year's ending inventory or depreciated value of 10% of purchase cost per project year.
- 5. Depreciation of 10% This will be 10%, per calendar year, of the original purchase cost for the items you will still have at the end of the project. This includes items you had at the beginning of the project as

well as items purchased during the current calendar year. Depreciation is the loss in value of your assets and is an expense. This calculation should be displayed as a money value. Your work needs to be checked with a calculator and must list the number of years you are depreciating.

- 6. Value at the end of the project- This is the value at the beginning of the project minus the depreciation.
- 7. Current Fair year equals year 1 for Depreciation Value

Total Gain - Final weight minus beginning weight.

Final Average Daily Gain (ADG) - Total Gain divided by the total number of days on feed. Date tagged to date of check- in. Number of project days is listed in the premium book.

Conversion - Pounds of Feed (FED) per pound of gain - Total pounds of feed fed divided by the total gain. Cost of Gain - Total feed cost divided by total gain.

Project Market Value - Final live weight multiplied by current market value. Market Value will be given at Final Check in.

Break Even Price – Total Expenses divided by Final weight
